Pikes Peak Country Attractions

### Cheyenne Mountain Zoo

America's only mountain zoo! Experience unforgettable adventures combining breathtaking scenery with more than 750 animals from around the world! Feed our world-famous giraffe herd (the largest of any zoo); soar over the Zoo in our new chairlift-style ride that offers sweeping views of the mountain and the city below; get nose-to-nose with gorillas and watch grizzlies fish for trout. Open daily. Take I-25 to exit 138 west.



### Seven Falls

A journey along South Cheyenne Canyon to Seven Falls takes you through the 42-foot-wide Pillars of Hercules with 1,000-foot cliffs above. The box canyon terminates dramatically at a 181-foot waterfall cascading down seven distinct steps. A mountain elevator makes the view accessible and summer lighting makes the experience magical. I-25 to U.S. 24 West, south on 21st Street, west on Cheyenne Blvd.



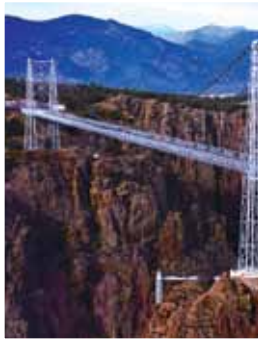
### Historic Manitou Springs

Located at the foot of Pikes Peak, Manitou Springs is one of Colorado's premier National Historic Districts. The naturally-carbonated mineral drinking springs that made Manitou Springs famous as a health resort in the late 1800's still flow freely today. 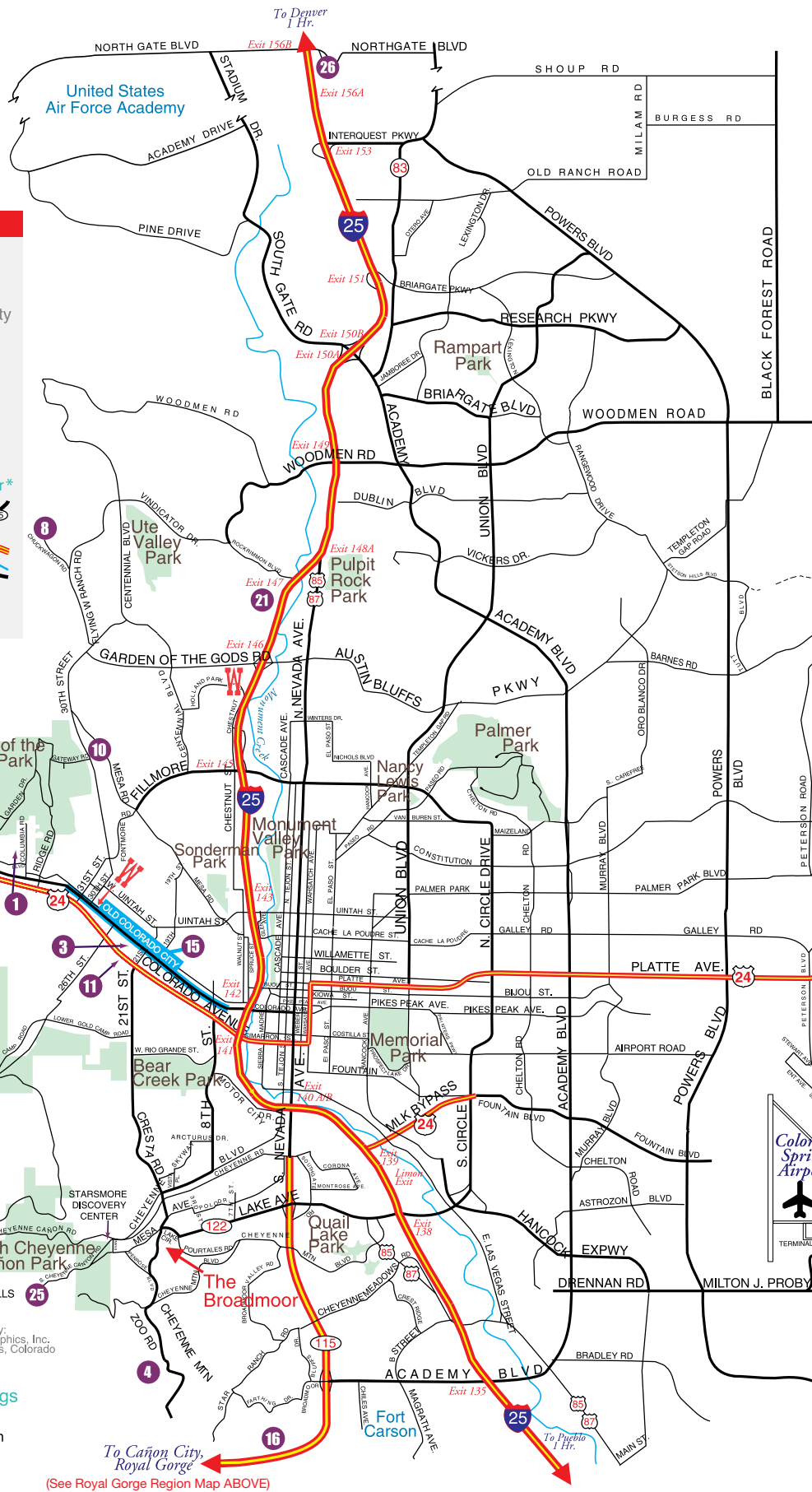
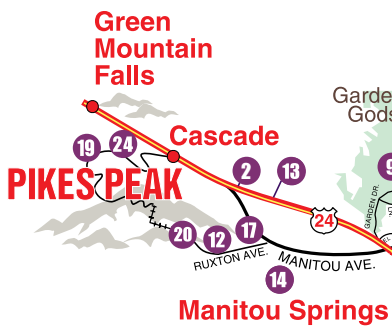
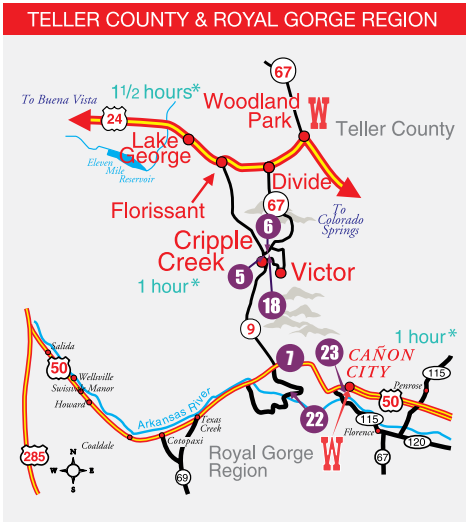
